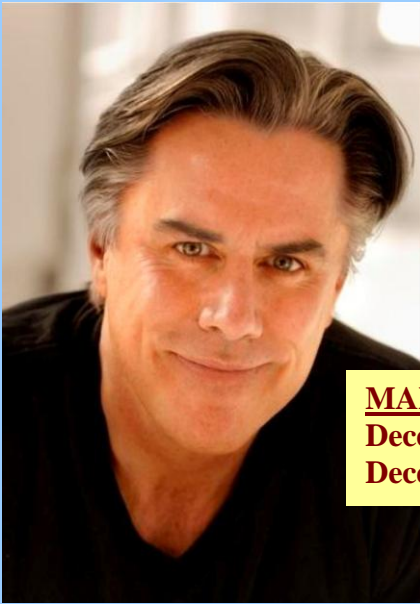


## Meet TheatreZone's Star Line-Up for our 2009-2010 Season

**JEFF McCARTHY** Most recently in New York, Jeff was Billy Flynn in the Broadway production of *Chicago*. Other starring roles on Broadway include Lockstock in *Urinetown*, Terry Turner in *Side Show*, Dubdhara in *The Pirate Queen*, Beast in *Beauty and the Beast*, Big Bob in *Smile*, Niko in *Zorba* (opposite Anthony Quinn) and *The Pirates of Penzance*. Los Angeles: *Les Misérables* (Javert), *The Three Sisters* (Vershinin), *Search and Destroy* (Martin), *A Little Night Music* (Frederick) and Stone in *City of Angels* (national tour). Off-Broadway: Lanford Wilson's *Sympathetic Magic* (Second Stage), *On The 20th Century* (York Theatre) and *Gifts of the Magi* (Lamb's). Regional: *Sweeney Todd* (Lyric Theater, Oklahoma) *You, Nero* (Berkeley Rep) *The Price* and *The Front Page* (Long Wharf Theater), *Camelot* and *Guys and Dolls* (The MUNY), *Mack and Mabel* and *Follies* (Barrington Stage), *Arms and the Man* (Huntington), *Bedroom Farce* (Center Stage), *The Music Man* (Casa Manana), *The Misanthrope* (The Guthrie), *Buried Child* and *Pantegleize* (ACT, San Francisco), *Henry IV* (Indiana Rep), *Sunday in the Park with George* (Seattle Rep) and *A Lie of the Mind* (Denver Center). Internationally, Mr. McCarthy toured the amphitheaters of Greece as Agamemnon in *Iphigenia in Aulis*. He starred in the La Fenice (Venice, Italy) revival of *Lady Be Good*, which subsequently aired on television throughout Europe. Other television credits include the title role in the PBS movie *Schweitzer*, guest-starring roles on *Star Trek TNG* and *Voyager*, *Love Monkey*, *Ed*, *Law & Order*, *Cheers*, *Knot's Landing*, *Designing Women*, *LA Law*, *In the Heat of the Night*, *Matlock*, *Equal Justice* (recurring) and several television movies. Films include: *Starting Out In The Evening*, the upcoming *Consent*, *RoboCop II*, *Eve of Destruction*, *Rapid Fire* and *Cliffhanger*. Jeff is the voice of the great Chuck Jones creation, Michigan J. Frog.

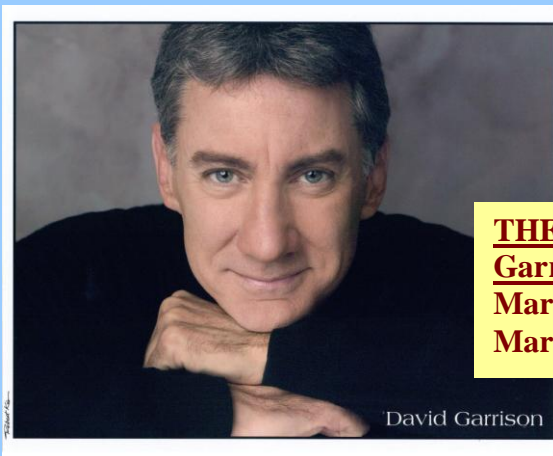


**HIGH SPIRITS, starring Georgia Engle**

**Georgia Engle** recently completed co-starring as Mrs. Tottendale in the Tony award-winning Broadway musical, *THE DROWSY CHAPERONE*. She launched her theatrical career playing Minnie Fay in *HELLO DOLLY* with Ethel Merman. She joined the original Off Broadway production of *HOUSE OF BLUE LEAVES* which went on to play in Hollywood. This led to Georgia being cast as Georgette Franklin in the *MARY TYLER MOORE SHOW* for which she would receive two Emmy Award nominations and begin a career of active work in television. She subsequently starred in four more television series, most notably as Shirley Burleigh in the ABC comedy, *COACH*. She has been seen in the recurring role of Pat McDougal in the long-running CBS hit comedy, *EVERYBODY LOVES RAYMOND*, for which she has been nominated for three Emmy awards. She recently completed a starring role in the Fox Broadcasting Network comedy pilot, *THE BEAST*.

Georgia returned to Broadway as Mickey in the Gershwin musical, *MY ONE AND ONLY*. She also starred in the Off Broadway musical, *CUT THE RIBBONS*. Her many regional appearances include *TIP TOES*, *BORN YESTERDAY*, *THE SKIN OF OUR TEETH*, *A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM*, *STEEL MAGNOLIAS*, *GUYS AND DOLLS*, and *SWEET CHARITY*. She costarred as Sister Mary Leo in the musical *NUNSENSE: THE 20<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY ALL-STAR TOUR*. Prior to that, she completed sold-out tours starring as Sister Amnesia in *NUNSENSE* and *NUNSENSE JAMBOREE*. She has costarred over many seasons at the St. Louis MUNY Opera in their productions of *MEET ME IN ST. LOUIS*, *MAME*, *CINDERELLA* and *SLEEPING BEAUTY*.

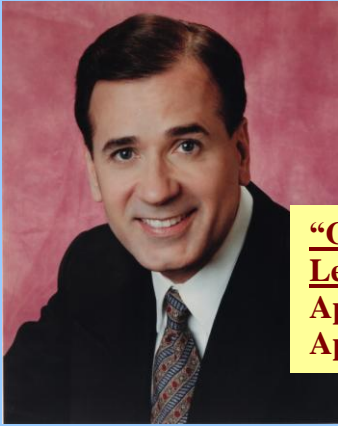
**THE BEAST OF BROADWAY, starring David Garrison**

**DAVID GARRISON**, best known as Steve Rhoades on television's *Married with Children*, most recently appeared on Broadway as the Wizard in *Wicked* following a national tour in the same role, for which he received the Carbonell Award. Other Broadway credits include *A Day in Hollywood/A Night in the Ukraine*, for which he received a Tony Award nomination and a Drama-Logue Award, *Titanic*, *Torch Song Trilogy*, *The Pirates of Penzance*, *Bells Are Ringing*, and *A History of the American Film*. Off-Broadway, he received a Drama Desk Award nomination for the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary revival of *I Do! I Do!*, and was featured in *New Jerusalem*, *Geniuses*, *The Torch-Bearers*, and *It's Only a Play*. He won a Helen Hayes Award for his work in Stephen Sondheim's *Merrily We Roll Along* at Arena Stage, and has starred in notable regional productions of *Die Fledermaus* at the Santa Fe Opera, Tom Stoppard's *Travesties* at the Williamstown Theatre Festival, and Randy Newman's *Faust* at both the La Jolla and Goodman Theatres.

His many television credits include Norman on *It's Your Move* and Stan on *Working It Out*, as well as guest performances on *Law and Order*, *The West Wing*, *The Practice*, *NYPD Blue*, *Without a Trace*, *Everybody Loves Raymond*, *Judging Amy*, *Murphy Brown*, *Murder She Wrote*, *Ed*, *L.A. Law*, *Tom Clancy's Op Center*, and the PBS Great Performances presentations of *On the Town* with the London Symphony, and *Ira Gershwin at 100: A Celebration at Carnegie Hall*.

He is a summa cum laude graduate of Boston University's School of Theatre Arts, and is the recipient of its Distinguished Alumni Award. His caricature on the wall at Sardi's looks at David Merrick's.

**Lee Roy Reams** won critical acclaim as Roger DeBris on Broadway and the First National Co. of Mel Brooks' musical hit, *The Producers* (Carbonell Award and Washington DC's prestigious Helen Hayes Award).

Columnist Liz Smith calls him "Broadway's Darling" and the New York Times hails him as "Broadway's song and dance man nonpareil" for his leading, roles in David Merrick's legendary *42nd Street* (Tony and Drama Desk nominations), Lumiere in Disney's *Beauty and the Beast*, Albin/ZaZa in *La Cage Aux Folles*, Cornelius Hackl in *Hello Dolly!* & Henry Spofford in *Lorelei* (both starring Carol Channing), Duane Fox in *Applause* starring Lauren Bacall, Will Parker in Richard Rodgers' revival of *Oklahoma!*, Bob Fosse's *Sweet Charity* starring Gwen Verdon, and *An Evening with Jerry Herman*. Favorite regional theatre roles include Captain Hook in *Peter Pan*, Toddy in *Victor/Victoria*, Alfred P. Doolittle in *My Fair Lady*, and Phil Davis in *White Christmas*. On Broadway, he directed *Hello, Dolly!* (Tony Nomination/Best Revival) and *An Evening With Jerry Herman*. He also directed *Anything Goes* starring Chita Rivera and productions of *Hello, Dolly!* starring Madeline Kahn, JoAnne Worley, Michelle Lee, and in Paris, Nicole Crosille. He is also the resident director of Theatre Guild's Theatre at Sea whose stars include Patricia Neal, Gena Rowlands, Rosemary Harris, Leslie Uggams, Ed Asner, Cliff Robertson, Eli Wallach, and Anne Jackson among others.

Favorite television appearances include: Jerry, Herman at the Hollywood Bowl (PBS and Bravo), *Showboat* (PBS), *In Performance at the White House* (PBS), three Tony Award Shows, *Night of 100 Stars II*, and *The Tonight Show*. Concerts and Cabaret have taken him to the White House and around the world: Venice's Teatro La Feitice, Brazil's Manatis Opera House, New York's Carnegie Hall (New York Pops and Cincinnati Pops), New York's Town Hall, Key West Pops, London's Palladium, Rockefeller Center's Rainbow & Stars (Bistro Award).

He's had the honor of performing for four U.S. Presidents: Jimmy Carter, Ronald Reagan, George H. Bush and Bill Clinton.
